Creating a more affordable New York is critical to the City's future, as other cities in this country and abroad compete to attract new jobs and new residents. My more affordable New York will benefit all New Yorkers, bringing new jobs for our workers, new customers for all our wonderful small businesses, and better quality of life for all.
